Visit Glasgow, Missouri, site of a Civil War battle in 1864 when Confederate troops bombarded the Union forces holding the town. The Union force was outnumbered and eventually forced to surrender. The Confederate were commanded by Brigadier General John Bullock Clark while the Union forces were under the command of Colonel Chester Harding. Included on the tour as time permits:

1st Street (current business district, oldest drug store in US, site of civil war wharf) World's first all-steel railroad bridge Turner's Hill – site of cannon fire into town Hereford House – now St. Mary's rectory and the end of the battle Dunhaven – home of banker Danica Washington Cemetery – burial site of the Stienmetz brothers Lewis Library – oldest library west of the Mississippi Randolph Street – historic homes of founders and campsite of Union troops Lewis Cemetery – burial site of Benjamin Lewis
