October Program

(Wed, Oct. 8, 7 pm, Chrisman High School)

A recent call asking about the Battle of Westport from a UMKC grad who is working on his Masters in History had me digging through my files looking for some of the research I had done for the final episode of the Civil War series, commonly known as the "Checkers" episode.

The caller, a long time Civil War enthusiast and re-enactor, wanted info on the Brush Creek and Loose Park part of the battle.

When I told him I had a listing showing the 14 engagements which made up the three day battle there was a long silence on the other end of the line. "How many engagements?" was the questioning response.

This is a very common reply when one talks about Westport.

Many realize the battle lasted three days, but many do not realize the fighting stretched from one end of town to the other and was an almost endless series of engagements.

At three separate places there were two active engagements within 12-15 hours, Can you name all three? Most cannot.

By laying the actions of the units into an hourly time frame, one can more easily see and understand what was really going on during those fateful days in late October of 1864.

Did you realize that one unit of Confederate infantry actually tried to capture downtown Kansas City?

Or that some units of Confederate cavalry stopped and had breakfast while fighting was going on within ear shot of their campfires?

All of the well known leaders of the War in the West were at this battle. Blunt, Ford, Jennison, Moonlight, and Pleasonton on the Federal side and Price, Shelby, Marmaduke, Cabell, Fagan, Jeff Thompson, Gordon, Collins, Perkins and Jackman for the Confederates.

Several handouts, including a tour map of the Little Blue battle sites will be available. Copies of the 1989 Battle of Westport souvenir programs will be for sale.
