Beverly Shaw made a tape of the program and I have a video of the pre-break portion. Anyone who was not present can contact either of us about a loaner copy.


I am still trying to work things out with the Designer Showcase Home. The date we wanted is filled and other dates she suggested do not fit our schedules.

The above puzzle was devised by **Toby Giese** as a part of the upcoming program on The Lincoln Conspiracy.

The puzzle utilizes the answers from the preceding page and is a bit sneaky.

As a part of the program **Bob Werline** will be bringing his authentic replica derringer and there will be a funeral badge from the Lincoln Funeral Train G.A.R. Post #1 of Springfield, Illinois, on display. This was the only G.A.R. Post with such a name.

As the name suggests, this post was made up solely and entirely of men who were guards on the Lincoln Funeral Train.

This group met only once a year and had a maximum membership of 128. The last meeting was in 1934 when only 3 were in attendance.

The funeral badge and other G.A.R. ribbons and pins will be under glass and I ask that they not be handled.

The newest one in my collection, a 1916 National Encampment Representative badge from the 50th Anniversary, Heart of America Encampment, held in KC, will be on display for the first time.

## To Save an old Cemetery

Congratulation are in order to Lois Spencer and the Melton Estates Home Owners Association for the successful effort to save the old Luttrell-Davis-Harris Burying Ground/Cemetery near 39th & Lee's Summit Road.

By agreement with the developer, the 1/4 acre plot is to be restored and fenced off.

Plus many of the original tombstones, removed by vandals in the late 1960's and early 1970's, are to be returned from the Missouri Town 1855 simulated cemetery.

Assistance, both financial physical, will be needed to complete Mr. & Mrs. Harold Potts the tombstone transfer.

This was presented to the Board at the March 26th meeting as a project our people might want to assist with.

The Board agreed and a motion to assist with the project was passed.

It is not often that we hear of a project such as this where we can assist in the restoration of an old cemetery instead of watching as an old piece of History gets bulldozed.

The study to determine which stones go where is already underway and the physical task of removing and replacing the markers should begin sometime this summer.

It is estimated \$15,000 will be needed to complete the project.

## Pharis Farm & Cabin Tour on Sat., May 18th

For those of you who were on the first Pharis Farm Tour and had the chance to met and talk to the then 94 year old former farmer and Ag Vo-Tech teacher, it was an experience you will not soon forget.

Don is gone now and his dream of a living history farm may never come true. The county has turned down the offer, as set up in Don's will, and the house and pre-1820's cabin set idle.

The cabin was found in the 1960's. A larger building had been built over it and it was wonderfully preserved.

Pharis, with the help of some friends, tore the cabin down and moved it to his farm.

The timbers set for a few years before the cabin was restored starting about 1974.

Don hung many tools from the past on the sides of the cabin and the inside of the 14 X 20 building is so homey you could move in in a flash of an eve.

Among the things of notice inside the 1859 two story brick home is the original land grant signed by President James Madison

Weather and road conditions permitting this tour will also visit the ruins of the Liberty Arsenal.

If you have been there before you will be surprised at how much destruction has taken place.

If you have not been there you will be surprised so much of it is still there.

Two very unique pieces of history neither of which is being preserved.

Time permitting the tour will also visit the Oregon Trail Crossing site.

If 24 or more chose to go we will use a bus. Cost will be \$12 per person. Invited guests are accepted.

Cost of the bus for 7 hours will be \$335. Tour Departs at 9 am from the K-Mart lot at Hwy 24 & Hwy 291.

Less than 24 going, we car pool. Lunch at Hardee's in Liberty.
